A quorum was present to conduct business.

ACTION: Motion to approve May 14, 2015, meeting minutes. Owens first. Macisco second. Motion passed.

The committee reviewed the "Unit 1 Curriculum" written by Mr. Smith. Under item 1) B. Public Relations, the members agreed to not be too specific in describing an applicant's physical stature and to remove the no tattoos. Employees are assigned jobs based on their abilities and diversity; a tattoo, for example, may be an asset if working undercover. Aside from this one correction, the committee agreed with all of the training scenarios presented by Mr. Smith. Mr. Smith described a game he developed for his class and is willing to share that idea with the web designers. The game made learning fun and systematic scoring helped motivate the students by knowing they may be ranked number three in the class or state. Mr. Smith asked about the video capacity of the web developers. Mr. Dutton said the training information given to the web developers needs to be specific, but then allow them latitude to develop the information into a video, a game, etc.

Mr. Myers showed a brief training video that he created and discussed the possibilities of using Blackboard or Google. Individual accounts can be created, and the training and results can be tracked. Once a user, the individual can take the test multiple times for only \$10.00. Blackboard has a better test site, but Google has quiz capability. A representative from Blackboard is willing to give a presentation to the committee.

Mr. Armstrong provided a Securitas training video for the committee to watch as another training example. Mr. Dutton requested copies and feels there is enough material for the web designers to create the first training module. The next Training Committee meeting will be scheduled after the DPS web developers have had an opportunity to work with the supplied information.
